



Staying in a one place and staying connected to multiple events through media. What if these different contrasting situations are visualized? What would they reflect after their combination? Joining of these elements creates a very unusual narrative all together. This is not convincing but this is what is going on in the world. These entire different socio-political situations when combined gives a completely bizarre and complex narrativity all together and I am interested in those. With an urge to understand these raised questions out of my own query. I try to frame and structure my artworks understanding and finding the answers to my quires.

Initially, I started my journey addressing local references combining 2 or more variables completely in contrast to each other. The reflection out of these combined composites interests me; and gradually aiming at addressing larger issues with wider domains.

Each subject has its own demands and I feel flexible to that needs. Choosing on whatever the work demands. The language of expression might remain the same, but its execution remains open ended. Presently, I have been exploring and exercising using collage, photomontage and painted reality as my medium. In regards to my practice, the process gets reflected itself in the final outcome and is not needed to represent separately. And also acknowledges the source references from where, the collectives are been found, in order to develop the finished work of art.

The working medium is clay at first, then it transforms into terracotta, fiber and bronze.














DEBAJIT RUDRA PAUL Agartala, India


with local tribal arts and design motifs.

natural entities are blooming in a very simple way, by which a free space is completed and I
























JOYDEB MONDAL Basirhat, West Bengal

JYOTIRMOY BHUYAN Guwahati , Assam





KABERI DUTTA Durgapur, West bengal


















RITI SARKAR Nadia, West Bengal














TANAY SINGHA Kolkata, India

SK. AVIK Kolkata, India






